“What is the reason for your hope?” Imagine somebody coming up to you and asking you that question. Not “What are you hoping for?” or “What are you hoping to do?” No, this isn’t about our desires for possessions or aspirations for life, it’s “Why do you hope?” Peter today tells us that we ought to be ready to give an answer to this question. Truth be told, few of us spend much time thinking about why we hope. Luckily, the scriptures today give us our answers. We hope because Christ suffered for us, in order that we might come to God. We hope because we know that, in the Spirit, God grants us another Advocate through Christ to remain with us always. No matter what we might hope for, whatever we might hope to do, we must always first know and proclaim the reason for our hope: the presence of God in Christ, with us through the power of the Spirit.

Coffee Filter Butterfly

You will need:

coffee filter
clothes pin
paint
water

1. Lay out your coffee filter and smooth it down flat.
2. Use your paints and water to paint different colors all over the filter. The colors will run into each other if your paint brush is really wet.
3. After the paint dries, gather the middle of the filter and clothes pin it together.
4. Open the ends of the filter to display the beautiful butterfly wings.
5. Draw or paint 2 eyes on top of the clothes pin for the eyes if you wish.

For extra fun, put a strip of magnetic tape on the back and display your butterfly on the refrigerator.
Or simply tie it to the string of your blinds so it can be flying around your window.

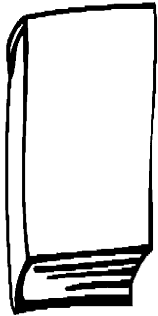

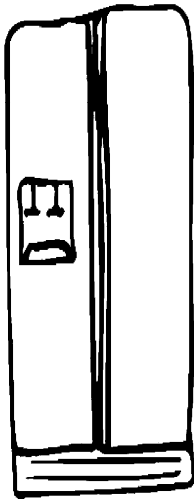
Directions: Write or draw a picture of when you had to choose between right and wrong and the Spirit helped you choose the right path.

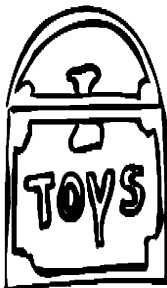


The Spirit is within us to help us follow the commandments and know Jesus.

Directions: Write something on the lines that might be inside the objects on the left.



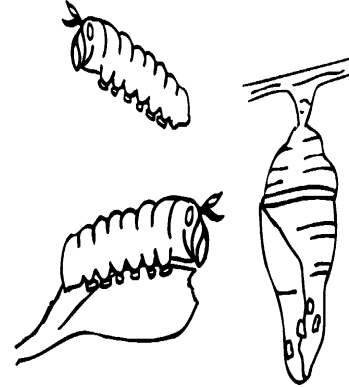
